**Draft Budget Review – FYE 4-30-13**

Staff reviewed the draft police department budget that will be presented to the full council on February 22, 2012. Staff advised that the draft may still be revised prior to the first budget meeting. Staff answered a number of questions from the police committee members.

**Taser Policy Review & Resistance Reports**

The staff reviewed police department policy number 309, *Taser Guidelines*. The staff also reviewed the police department report resistance response activity which is used to maintain records of action police officers take when a subject is resisting arrest. The staff also demonstrated the taser replacement units that are included in the draft budget.

**Sale of Surplus Property**

Staff presented a recommended list of city property to be declared as surplus property and auctioned using an on-line auction service. The property included a number of vehicles that are being replaced and various other small pieces of equipment. The Police Committee unanimously recommended approval of an ordinance declaring the items surplus property and that the property to be auctioned using Public Surplus or be disposed of.

SINCE MY ARRIVAL IN DARIEN I HAVE CONSISTENTLY TALKED ABOUT THE QUALITY AND MRIT OF THE DARIEN POLICE DEPARTMENT. ALONG THOSE LINES MY DISCUSSION HAS BEEN THAT ONE OF THE

LARGER MERITS OF MY APPOINTMENT WAS TO ENSURE THAT THE POLICE DEPARTMENT WAS PREPARED TO ADDRESS THE CONSISTENTLY GROWING DISPLACEMENT OF CRIME. IN MONDAY'S CHICAGO SUN TIMES, TIMES REPORT FRANK MAIN DISCUSSES THE MIGRATION OF CHICAGO STREET GANGS TO THE WESTERN SUBURBS. THIS IS NOT A SCARE TACTIC BUT A GROWING RELIANTLY BASED UPON SOME TIME PROVEN CRIME FIGHTING TECHNIQUES;

- INTENSIVE GANG PROBATION MONITORS ON AN ON-GOING BASIS THE ACTIVITY OF GANG MEMBERS WHEN THEY ARE RELEASED AFTER BEING INCARCERATED.
- GEOGRAPHIC RESTRICTIONS, OFTEN TIMES GEOGRAPHIC RESTRICTIONS ARE PLACED UPON A GANG MEMBER IN ORDER TO PREVENT HIM/HER FROM GOING BACK TO THE SAME LOCATIONS AND PLYING THEIR TRADES. THIS IS SPECIFICALLY EFFECTIVE FOR THOSE IN A LEADERSHIP ROLE BECAUSE IT PREVENTS THEM FROM ATTEMPTING TO RESUME A LEADERSHIP POSITION AFTER INCARCERATION. ATTEMPTING TO RE-ASSUME A LEADERSHIP POSITION FOR A RECENTLY RELEASED GANG MEMBER NEARLY ALWAYS RESULTS IN VIOLENCE.
- THE USE OF THE CAPS OR COMMUNITY POLICING CRIME TRIANGLE. THE TRIANGLE IS BASED UPON AN ATTACK OF A CRIME PROBLEM BY LOOKING AT THE THREE SIDES OF THE CRIME TRIANGLE (VICTIM/OFFENDER/LOCATION) BY DETERMINING WHAT MAKES A LOCATION ATTRACTIVE AND ATTACKING THAT LOCATION, IT NO LONGER BECOMES AN ATTRACTIVE PLACE TO COMMIT CRIMES. THIS TACTIC MAY INVOLVE CLOSING UNDESIRABLE BUSINESSES, BOARDING UP OR TEARING DOWN UNDESIRABLE HOUSING OR RE-ALLOCATING MORE CITY RESOURCES TO ADDRESS THE PROBLEMS. SIMILARLY, LOOKING AT THE VICTIMS, WE DETERMINE, WHAT CREATES A VULNERABILITY FOR THE VICTIM, WHY IS IT ATTRACTIVE FOR PEOPLE TO BE VICTIMIZED . THE VICTIM SIDE OF THE TRIANGLE IS THEN ADDRESSED. (POD EXAMPLE)
- FINALLY, THE REORGANIZATION OF THE CHICAGO POLICE DEPARTMENT AND THE RE-ALLOCATION OF RESOURCES TO ENSURE THAT MANPOWER IS FOCUSED ON THOSE AREAS WHERE THE CRIME IS MOST PREVALENT.

WITH EACH OF THESE LAW ENFORCEMENT TACTICS, THERE IS A DISPLACEMENT OR POTENTIAL FOR DISPLACEMENT TO OCCUR. MUCH LIKE THE LAWS OF PHYSICS OR BIOLOGY, WHEN TOO MUCH PRESSURE IS APPLIED IN ONE AREA THE ITEM WILL ALWAYS SEEK A LOCATION OF LESSER CONCENTRATION, SO GANG MEMBERS FROM CHICAGO WILL GO TO THE PLACES WHERE THERE IS LESS SCRUTINY, LESS ENFORCEMENT, LESS KNOWLEDGE ABOUT WHO THEY ARE, LESS KNOWLEDGE ABOUT THEIR BUSINESS WORKINGS.

IN THAT REGARD, WITNESSING CHICAGO'S CRIMINAL STREET GANGS, MIGRATE FROM AN AREA OF HIGHER CONCENTRATION, HIGHER AWARENESS AND HIGHER SCRUTINY TO AN AREA THAT THEY PERCEIVE IS LESS CONCENTRATED AND LESS DETRIMENTAL TO THEIR CRIMINAL ENTERPRISE, MAKES PERFECT BUSINESS SENSE, AND WE MUST BE PREPARED TO MEET AND DEFEAT THE THREAT.

AS WE IN THE PD LOOK FOR WAYS TO REDUCE EXPENSES, EVERY AREA OF OUR OPERATION IS BEING REVIEWED. ONE AREA CURRENTLY UNDER REVIEW IS THE SERVICE WE PROVIDE TO THE PUBLIC IN

PICKING UP STRAY, ABANDONED OR WILD ANIMALS AND THE FEES THAT WE PAY FOR THAT PUBLIC SERVICE, WE ARE LOOKING AT WAYS TO REDUCE THE EXPENSE.

**SUBJ: DU-COMM ISSUES**

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At the last committee meeting we were asked to bring forward DU-COMM issues for the last 90 days.

We switched over to DU-COMM dispatch services on April 26<sup>th</sup>, 2011 after many months of preparation. Darien staff looked into DU-COMM from many angles.

DU-COMM started operations in 1975 and today dispatches for 38 police and fire departments throughout DuPage County. Darien joined DU-COMM with Lisle and Woodridge Police Departments and the Darien-Woodridge Fire District. The newest members to join DU-COMM are Oak Brook PD/FD, Wood Dale Fire Protection District and the Itasca Fire Protection District.

We sent out a questionnaire to all DU-COMM police agencies to see what they thought of DU-COMM. We received back positive confirmation from the police agencies.

**CHANGE IS HARD** – most people like things the way they were. When we started working on getting ready to move we found some differences. DU-COMM has standard ways of operating for all police departments. Some of these were new to Darien.

Some changes included –

- Dispatched by beat assignment – not badge numbers
- Dispatchers cannot run criminal histories for officers
- Went from knowing 11 dispatchers to over 75 dispatchers that you do not know
- Using a different set of radio and computer codes
- Having dispatch pull incident numbers on everything including Traffic Stops
- Different processes for entering people/items into LEADS computer
- Sharing the radio channel with 3 agencies instead of 2
- Working with a new agency on the radio for the first time.



- Dealing with a patched radio system between the SEDCOM UHF system and the Woodridge 800 MHz system – waiting for STARCOM to come on-line

DU-COMM has advanced technology. They offer several programs that allow officers to check call status on the computer, ability to add and remove items/people from LEADS, electronic over-night parking permission system and an incident clarification system (ICF) – when supervisors need to question how a call was handled by DU-COMM.

DU-COMM encourages member agencies to file ICFs if there was something that needs to be reviewed or checked. They provide feedback in a written report along with audio recordings of radio traffic and 911 calls. DU-COMM will hold their employees accountable for poor service.

We have been with DU-COMM for the past 10 months. There has been some frustration by officers, dispatchers and maybe some citizens. From checking numbers – I show 43 ICFs were filled in the 8 months of 2011. In 2012 – I have 4.

DU-COMM answers a lot of calls – in 2011 – 794,000 phone calls – 290,000 were 911 calls. They have a system that routes calls through the center. When someone calls 911 in Darien, the call does not always go directly to the dispatcher that is assigned Darien along with Lisle and Woodridge PDs.

This type of center works because of the technology in place. I believe we are still getting use to the differences in DU-COMM from our old center. DU-COMM will tell you a multi – jurisdictional center is different from a standalone center like we use to have. DU-COMM will also tell you they are not perfect. We had issues with our dispatch center and dispatchers. The difference was that most of them had worked for Darien and Lisle for many years. Compare that to the 10 months at DU-COMM.

Some of the frustration in the radio communication has been the patch between two radio systems. It works but is not ideal. Hopefully STARCOM will make these issues disappear.

I have included some samples of ICFs that have been submitted. The chief and I are having DU-COMM send us a monthly report to better track these issues – will start in March. We will share this with the committee.

I believe as we move forward, issues will drop off based on being more familiar with each other.

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## **DU-COMM Fact Sheet**

DU-COMM is a consolidated 9-1-1 Public Safety Communications Center that serves thirty eight (38) police and fire agencies, and the combined population of over 800,000 citizens. DU-COMM is a unit of local government as defined by the Illinois Intergovernmental Cooperation Act. Dedicated to public safety, DU-COMM began operations in 1975, and is currently located at: 600 Wall Street in Glendale Heights, IL.

### **FUNDING**

DU-COMM's annual operating expenses are funded solely by member agency contributions. The Municipalities and Fire Protection Districts pay their Police and/or Fire agency's shares based on our funding formula. Many large capital systems are supported by the DuPage County Emergency Telephone System Board (ETSB) that collects 9-1-1 Surcharge in DuPage County. There are two types of surcharge. The first is wire line surcharge that the ETSB collects at \$0.50 on all wired phones in the county. The second is the wireless surcharge where the ETSB collects \$0.58 of a \$0.75 wireless surcharge on cell phones.

### **Staff:**

DU-COMM is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year. DU-COMM's staff is comprised of 62 full-time Telecommunicators, 4 part-time Telecommunicators, 3 part-time Alarm Board Operators, 6 Operations Managers, a Training Manager, an EMD Quality Coordinator, 3 Radio Technicians, a Technical Services Manager, 3 MIS Specialists, a part-time GIS Coordinator, a Support Services Manager, a Finance Clerk, an Office Assistant, Executive Secretary, Finance/Human Resources Manager, Deputy Director, and an Executive Director.

### **Call Volume:**

In 2011, DU-COMM answered over **794,000** phone calls, approximately **290,000** of those calls were 9-1-1 calls, and over **85,000** of those 9-1-1 calls were made using wireless phones. Additionally, DU-COMM handles support services for municipal alarm boards, and is the primary dispatch center for MABAS Divisions 12 and 16.

### **DU-COMM serves the following agencies:**

Addison Fire Protection District, Bartlett Fire Protection District, Bartlett Police Department, Carol Stream Fire Protection District, Carol Stream Police Department, Darien Police Department, Darien-Woodridge Fire Protection District, Elmhurst Fire Department, Elmhurst Police Department, Glen Ellyn Fire Department, Glen Ellyn Police Department, Glenside Fire Protection District, Hanover Park Fire Department, Hanover Park Police Department, Lisle Police Department, Lisle-Woodridge Fire Protection District, Lombard Fire Department, Lombard Police Department, Oakbrook Terrace Fire Protection District, Oakbrook Terrace Police Department, Roselle Fire Department, Roselle Police Department, Villa Park Fire Department, Villa Park Police Department, Warrenville Fire Protection District, Warrenville Police Department, West Chicago Fire Protection District, West Chicago Police Department, Wheaton Fire Department, Wheaton Police Department, Winfield Fire Protection District, Winfield Police Department, Woodridge Police Department, and York Center Fire Protection District. Oak Brook Police and Fire departments, Wood Dale Fire Protection District, and Itasca Fire Protection District will join DU-COMM in June/July, 2012, increasing the number of agencies served by DU-COMM from thirty four (34) to thirty-eight (38).

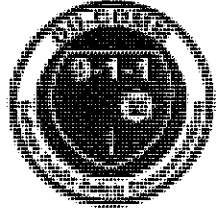
